

Graham, the factory manager will be there to speak and answer questions. Tom Hill that handles our problems that relate to your car is always available to talk to owners.


It really is a fun filled day. The race, the entertainment (you have to see it to believe it) and all that happens make for a fantastic event.

The world's fastest street-legal car

Boutique automaker unveils a 1,183-horsepower road rocket

On Sept. 13, 2007, the Shelby SuperCars' Ultimate Aero became the fastest production car in the world. The event took place on a temporarily closed, two-lane stretch of public highway in Washington State. In accordance with Guinness World Records' strict policies, the car had to drive down the highway, turn around, and make a second pass in the opposite direction within one hour.

The Aero posted 257.41 mph.

The Areo broke the offical record held by the Volkswagen's \$1.6 million Bugatti.

The Bugatti costs 2.5 times as much as the Areo.

NASCA's wind tunnel found the Areo to be aerodynamically stable at speeds up to 273 mph before it ran out of road.

This is an American built car.

Jerod Shelby (no relation to Carroll Shelby) realized his financial success by developing patents for Advance Imaging Technology. He developed a radiation-free medical device that uses sound waves to scan for breast cancer.

The Areo does NOT have traction control - it is pure sports car.

It takes three and a half months to hand build the Areo.

It broke Ferrari Enzo's slalmon course record.

Corvette has a future--but maybe a lighter, greener one The 2009 ZR1 may be the tops for Corvette horsepower in the future.

The Chevrolet Corvette will live on despite tougher fuel economy rules. But the redesigned car, expected in about 2012, could be lighter and smaller than today's Corvette.

And the V8 that powers the Corvette of the future may be smaller than the one used today.

"I don't think we're going to design a 700-hp Corvette," Tom Wallace, vehicle line executive for the Corvette, said at the Detroit auto show. "What's going to be more important is fuel economy, carbon footprint and green. We have already paid a lot of attention to those areas. Where we can pay more attention is pounds per horsepower."

Two engines are offered for the 2008 model year, a 430-hp 6.2-liter V8 and a 505-hp 7.0-liter V8. The 2009 ZR1 features a 620-plus hp supercharged 6.2-liter V8.



Wallace won't talk about specifics of the next-generation Corvette. But he said if the car's weight was dropped by 300 to 400 pounds and a 4.7-liter V-8 is offered with 150 fewer horsepower than the 2008 models, the "pounds per horsepower are the same."

Wallace said he envisions a Corvette that is "more fuel efficient ... even nimbler than it was before. But he said no decision has been made about horsepower or engine size.

The 2009 ZR1 will have a top speed over 200 mph.

Rather than trying to top those performance numbers, Wallace said: "I think we need to say, 'We reached performance levels that are pretty good. Let's maintain those and improve fuel economy.'"

24 HOURS ROLEX RACE
